- Foreground, Middle Ground, Background — the layering trifecta.













Layering is a Way of Seeing

- Practice daily
- Observe movement
- Trust your intuition



The Process (Step-by-Step)

1. Find the Background First
2. Position Yourself Intentionally
3. Let the Scene Come to You
4. Press the Shutter at the Right Gesture
5. Shoot More Than You Think You Need

- Presence, joy, spontaneity — layered naturally through immersion.





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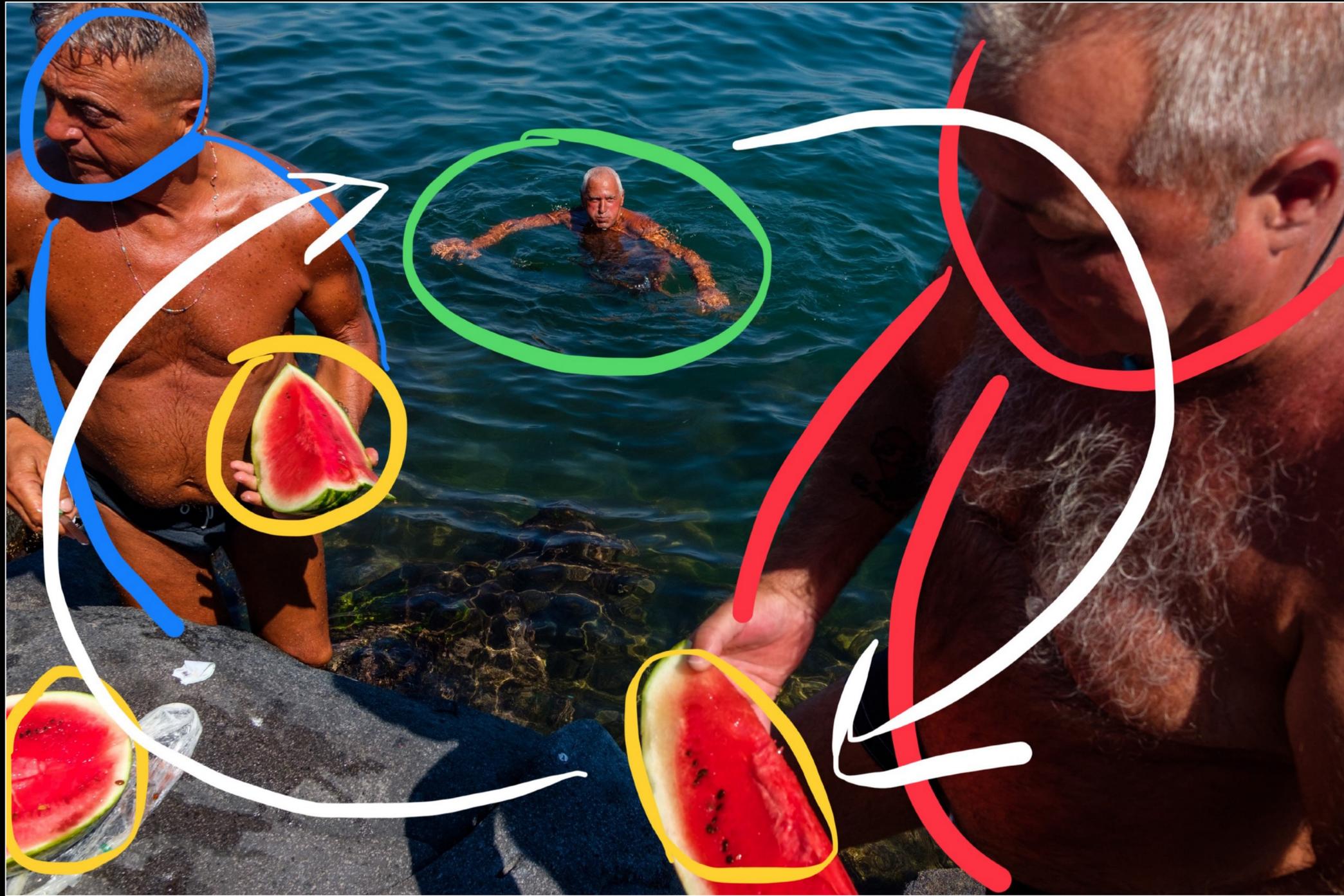


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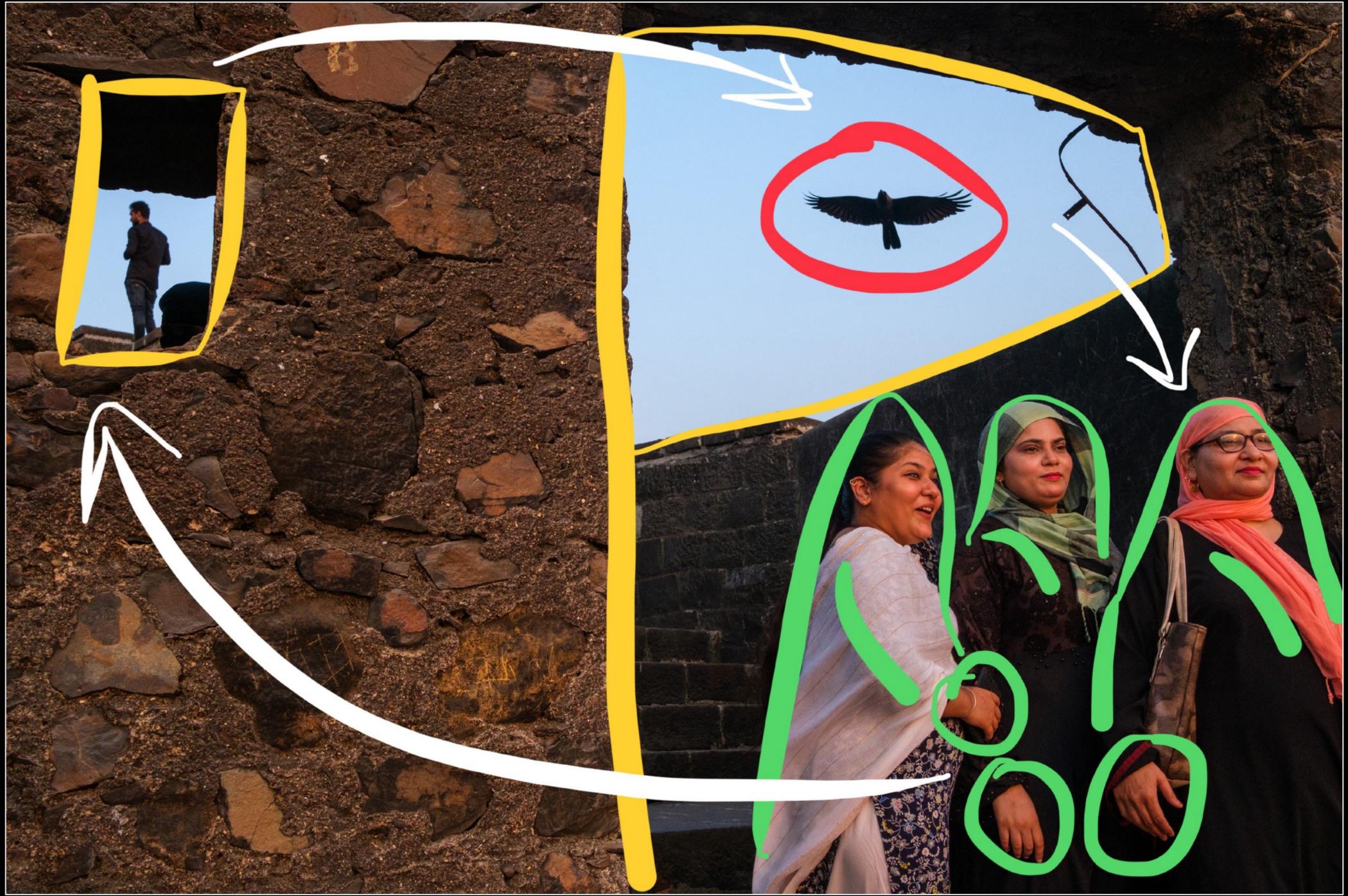

Final Philosophy

- You can't force a layered composition. You position yourself where things are happening—and let life unfold.



The 10 Laws of Layering

1. Shoot a lot and stay patient
2. Engage with your subjects
3. Focus on all three planes
4. Find the background first
5. Position your camera intentionally
6. Look for gestures
7. Take risks
8. Embrace chaos
9. Practice visual problem-solving
10. Spend time observing the
